#### **Additional Requirements in English**

- \_\_\_\_\_ ENGL 208 (1 credit; offered in fall only; take fall of sophomore year or first fall at Longwood for transfer students; prerequisites or co-requisites: EDUC 245 and EDUC 260)
- \_\_\_\_\_ ENGL 350 (3 credits; prerequisite: ENGL 209; offered in spring only)
- \_\_\_\_\_ ENGL 382 (3 credits; prerequisite: ENGL 209)

#### **Before Admission to the Teacher Preparation Program**

- \_\_\_\_\_ Enroll yourself in the OPS Canvas course: <https://canvas.longwood.edu/enroll/XHDFLT>
- \_\_\_\_\_ Submit passing scores on 2 tests in the Teacher Prep course in Canvas: (1) VCLA Reading & Writing (470 or higher; more information available at [www.va.nesinc.com](http://www.va.nesinc.com)) and (2) Praxis 1 CASE Math (150 or higher; information at <https://www.ets.org>), SAT Math (530), or ACT Math (22). SAT scores can also qualify you for admission to Teacher Prep:
- If you took the SAT prior to March 1, 2016, combined SAT scores of 1100 (530 or higher for math and 530 or higher for verbal) will qualify you for admission.
  - If you took the SAT on or after March 1, 2016, combined SAT scores of 1170 (560 or higher on math and 580 or higher on evidence-based reading and writing) will qualify you for admission.
- See the OPS website for additional combinations of passing test scores such as ACT that will qualify you for admission. You still must pass the VCLA before student teaching.
- \_\_\_\_\_ EDUC 245 (3 credits; must pass with at least a C before admission to Teacher Prep. Program; this course also counts toward the Human Behavior and Social Institutions Pillar of the Civitae Core Curriculum)
- \_\_\_\_\_ EDUC 260 (2 credits; must pass with at least a C before admission to Teacher Prep. Program)
- \_\_\_\_\_ *Complete Teacher Preparation Application in Canvas* by Oct. 1 or Mar. 1; Dec. 15 for transfer students—ideally at the end of the first semester of sophomore year; see OPS Canvas course for details.
- \_\_\_\_\_ Maintain an overall 3.0 gpa (You may be accepted into Teacher Prep. with a gpa as low as 2.5, but there is no guarantee.)

#### **After Admission to the Teacher Preparation Program**

- \_\_\_\_\_ EDUC 370: Practicum II (3 credits; sophomore or junior year; Summer Session I only; there is no Practicum I for English education; application due in MyLongwood by fourth Monday in November)

- \_\_\_\_\_ EDUC 473 (3 credits; application due in MyLongwood by the fourth Monday in April if you are taking the class in the fall; by the fourth Monday in November if you are taking it in the spring)

- \_\_\_\_\_ EDUC 487 (3 credits)
- \_\_\_\_\_ ENGL 482 Directed Student Teaching (12 credits). Note: Students must request a placement that is no farther than one hour away; see the list on the English Student Resources webpage.

**To student teach in VA, you must be eligible to teach except for completing ENGL 482 Student Teaching.**

\_\_\_\_\_ **Submit a passing score on Praxis II Test: English Language, Literature, and Composition**, Test #5038 (167 or higher); the test is only offered occasionally and scores take weeks; see info at <https://www.ets.org>. Submit scores with other requirements, but the last date to submit scores if you fail and have to retake is July 1 for fall student teaching and the third Monday of January for spring student teaching.
